

Staying the Course

Suppose we are about to start upon a voyage. The owner of the vessel gives us a book of directions, telling us that it contains instructions sufficient for our whole journey, and that if we will heed them, we shall reach in safety our port of destination. Setting sail we open our book to learn its contents.

We find that its author lays down general principles to govern us in our voyage and instructs us as far as practicable, touching the various contingencies that may arise, till the end; but he also tells us that the latter part of our journey will be especially perilous; that the features of the coast are ever changing by reason of quicksands and tempests; "but for this part of the journey," says he, "I have provided you a pilot, who will meet you, and give you such directions as the surrounding circumstances and dangers may require; and to him you must give heed."

With these directions we reach the perilous time specified and the pilot, according to promise, appears. But some of the crew, as he offers his services, rise up against him. "We have the original book of directions."

Say they, "and that is enough for us. We stand upon that, and that alone; we want nothing of you." Who now heed that original book of directions? Those who reject the pilot, or those who receive him, as the book instructs them? Judge ye.

Who now stand upon the Bible, and Bible alone?

But some, through lack of perception, or lack of principle, or ebullitions of an unconquerable prejudice, one, or all combined, may meet us at this point like this: "Then you would have us take Sister White as our pilot, would you?

It is to forestall any efforts in this direction, that this sentence is penned. We say no such thing. What we do say is distinctly this: that the gifts of the Spirit are given for our pilot through these perilous times, and wherever and whomsoever we find genuine manifestations of these, we are bound to respect them, nor can we do otherwise without in so far rejecting the Word of God, which directs us to receive them. Who now stand upon the Bible, and Bible alone?

Let none then be frightened at this false alarm. A moment's consideration will show who receive the Bible, and who do not. Whoever receives it fully, will receive the pilot according to its directions.

We do not, then, discard, but obey, the Bible by endorsing the visions; while we should just so far reject and disobey it, as we should refuse to receive the provisions it has made for our comfort, edification, and perfection.


Why is it important to meet these pseudo-doctrines

"False teachers may appear to be very zealous for the work of God, and may expend means to bring their theories before the world and the church; but as they mingle error with truth, their message is one of deception, and will lead souls into false paths. They are to be met and opposed, not because they are bad men, but because they are teachers of falsehood, and are endeavoring to put upon falsehood the stamp of truth" TM 55.

"Let the plain, simple statements of the Word of God be food for the mind; this speculating upon ideas that are not clearly presented there is dangerous business." 1 SM 181.

"All present truth believers should now see the necessity of shunning every wind of doctrine regardless how plausible or reasonable it might appear to be.... Get your doctrine, brother, sister only from the golden bowl...and be not like the waves of the sea, driven with the wind and tossed—be not carried about by the many winds of doctrine that are blowing wildly from every direction to cause you to lose your way to the everlasting Kingdom."

"Inspiration says: 'There are those today who will present falsehoods as testing truths,....When those who profess to believe present truth come to their senses, when they accept the Word of God just as it reads, when they do not try to wrest the Scriptures, they will bring from the treasure-house of the heart things new and old, to strengthen themselves and those for whom they laborc R & H June 18, 1901. 3 Ans. p. 57, 58.



Important facts to keep in mind

"The Enemy made Laodiceans believe they have no need of truth,...
Now we really are enriched with
Truth if we have studied and assimilated what has been given us,...
There the Devil is not going to attack us where he attacked Laodiceans, but he will tell us that we are poor in truth." 1 SC 2:11.

"From these and many other examples, we see that God not only never delegates one agent to alter, to reset, or to countermand the message with which His first making the matter known to both,..." 1 Ans p. 58.

"Remember, too, that the practice of comparing statements stripped of the context is fundamentally disingenuous, and leads today to as many perversions and misapplications of truth as does the deliberate wresting practiced in Satan's challenge to Christ." 1 Ans p. 48

"Those who desire to doubt will have plenty of room. God does not propose to remove all occasion for unbelief. He gives evidence, which must be carefully investigated with a humbly mind and a teachable spirit, and all should decide form the weight of evidence..." 5T 675.

Bashan theories

In addition to the Basic beliefs of the Davidian SDA's, Bashan adherents hold:

1. That Carmel (Mic. 7:14, Amos 1:2) withered in 1955 with Brother Houteff's death. Some say at the time of the "Fiasco", or false prediction of Ez. 9 by Sister Houteff and others. See keys of the kingdom p. 44 ("Keys")

- of the Kingdom" is a bashan publication).
- 2. That we are now feeding in the Bashan pasture.
- 3. That the Gilead pasture will exist in the time of the Kingdom.
- 4. That the living Spirit of Prophecy is the living human agent, the prophets or messengers of God.
- 5. That the church must have a living prophet, the Living Spirit of Prophecy (according to their understanding) at all times to guide and direct the church.
- 6. That the Porter (the prophet) (1TG 2:19,20) is to inspect the "sheep" or church members and leaders as they enter the fold—the church.
- 7. That the Porter/Prophet/

President is today Brother Trevor Bingham residing presently at Exeter, Missouri, USA.

 There must be a president at all times to fulfill the order described in the Leviticus of D.S.D.A.

Note: The above teachings if accepted leads the believer to a host of many other theories taking them further away, out to sea and only a miracle may pull one back to the solid earth of truth.

Let us now examine these eight points to see what the Rod teaches.

Carmel-when does it wither?

To understand this we need to read 1 SR 243.

"Feed thy people with thy rod, the flock of thine heritage, which dwell solitary in the wood, in the midst of Carmel: Let them feed in Bashan and Gilead, as in the days of old." Feed thy people with the rod": The verb "feed" is to be understood as spiritual food, and that food (truth) is found in the 'Rod', therefore we again have the command to give out the book ("Feed thy [God's] people"). Carmel, Bashan, and Gilead are used as symbols of good spiritual pasture."

Carmel, Bashan and Gilead are Spiritual Pastures, not literal. Notice that all three are used to represent a single spiritual pasture.

The feeding began in 1929/30 when the Rod was first presented—
Thus the Carmel pasture came into existence in 1929/30. Mt Carmel
Center was not established until
1934/35 (1 SC 10:1-3.) Therefore, Mt
Carmel Center itself could not be the Carmel pasture.

So when does Carmel wither? Is it in 1955 as Bashan teaches? Let us find out.

"And he said, The Lord will roar from Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the habitations of the shepherds shall mourn, and the top of Carmel shall wither." Amos 1:2.

This passage explains that Carmel will wither when the Lord roars from Zion. When will the Lord "roar from Zion"?

"With a few comments on the above scripture, any bible student will recognize at a glance that it applies at the time of the end, as explained by the gospel prophet: 'And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills...for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.' (Isa. 2:2, 3), which in the language of Amos is, 'Utter his voice from Jerusalem."

11 SC 12 p. 30.

Commenting on Amos 1:2 further the prophet says:

"This scripture, you see, reflects the tragedy which took place on the top of Carmel in the days of Elijah. Here we are given the hint that there is to be another show-down between the prophet of God and the prophets of Baal.." 1TG 42, p.7.

We see that the Lord roaring from Zion is the same as the Gospel being proclaimed from Zion—during the time of the Loud Cry, at which time Carmel will wither. We see furthar that the antitypical "show down" between the the prophet of God and the prophets of Baal, which is Ezekiel 9, must take place before Carmel withers.

Since Ezekiel 9 as well as the Lord roaring from Zion are yet future, it means that Carmel has not withered.

In 11SC12 p. 30, Bro. Houteff

gives a double application to Amos 1:2. He shows that the closing of probation for the church and the world is symbolized by the withering of Carmel. That both of these events are yet future. Therefore, we are still in the Carmel period. Carmel could not have withered when Bro. Houteff died.

Where do we place Bashan and Gilead

Inspiration is silent on Bashan & Gilead. Any proposed interpretation of Bashan and Gilead is classed as private interpretation—devising of men. We'll have to wait until the scroll unrolls in the Kingdom.

Unfortunately, some have endeavored to interpret Bashan and Gilead by using Isa 33:9: But Brother Houteff himself provides no interpretation of the verse. See 1TG 34:12.

Any other attempt to interpret verses not found in "The Bowl" must be discounted.

"Find your explanations in the Bowl," and you will have no trouble in knowing the truth, or of avoiding the ever ready trap of deception. Thus the difficulty in knowing the difference between truth and error is eliminated." 2SR 289.

The Living Spirit of Prophecy

Those purporting the Bashan theories generally read statements from the Rod's Message where Brother Houteff stresses the need of the living Spirit of Prophecy in the church, (1TG 10:27) and then proceed to define the living Spirit of Prophecy as the human agent or prophet. Such a definition is inserted in their explanation of the writings but not from the inspired writer (Brother V. Houteff) himself. On

this supposition or assumption rests their ENTIRE MESSAGE.

What is the Living Spirit of Prophecy?

The false notion promoted by Bashan that the Living Spirit of Prophecy is a man or linked to a human being is contrary to the teachings of the prophet. The following references explain beautifully what the living Spirit Of Prophecy is.

2 TG 45:6-"And what is the Spirit of prophecy? - The same chapter and verse give the answer:

"And I fell at his feet," at the feet of the one who unfolded the prophecy to John, "to worship him. And he said unto me, See thou do it not: I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren that have the testimony of Jesus: worship God: for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy." Rev. 19:10.

"Here it is seen that as the prophecies were unfolded to John by one of his brethren, thereby was revealed to him the Testimony of Jesus, the Spirit of Prophecy. Plainly, then, an inspired servant of God who bears a message to his brethren, bears the Testimony of Jesus to them. To illustrate: Suppose the Lord Jesus communicated a personal message to you by a messenger, would not His message be His testimony to you? And should God endow the messenger with the gift of His Spirit to unfold to you the prophecies which are in the Scriptures, would he not be coming to you with the Spirit of Prophecy?

"Thus it is clear that the "Testimony of Jesus" and "the Spirit of Prophecy" are synonymous terms for a timely message sent from God-"meat in due season." The Spirit of prophecy, therefore,

is God's means of communicating from Heaven directly to His church on earth, as well as of unfolding the sealed prophecies to her."

2 TG 45:8-"Since it now is clear as sunlight that the ever-unfolding, Inspired interpretation of the Scriptures is the ever-living Spirit of Prophecy, the eyes of the church at work (1 Sam. 9:9), then to be without these spiritual eyes is to try to walk, as it were, in dense darkness"

2 TG 20:24-"There is but one thing that consists of three such parts (two sheep and a young cow) that is capable of keeping the world alive, and that is the Bible -unfolded by the Spirit of Prophecy, the Spirit that leads into all Truth. . . . Hence it is none other than the published works of the everliving Spirit of Prophecy- the inspired interpretation of the Scriptures."

2 TG 41:21 - "A "disciple" is one who follows Christ on and on in Divinely-revealed Truth which he accepts not because others do, or do not, but because the Father which is in Heaven has through His Spirit personally convinced him of it (Matt. 16:17)-because independent of what others do or say he is personally persuaded by the Spirit. And the "testimony" is His living Word passed on by His chosen and Spirit-filled messengers - "the Spirit of Prophecy" at work (Rev. 19:10)."

2 TG 14:17-"The testimony of Jesus Christ, Inspiration explains, is "the Spirit of Prophecy." Rev. 19:10. To have the Spirit of Prophecy, is to have the Spirit Who uttered the prophecies and who only can interpret them, for "no prophecy of the Scripture is of any private interpretation," nor without the inspiration of the same Spirit."

6 Tr 30 - "The Volumes" 6 Tr 78 - "The Writings" 2 SR - "The Bowl" 3 Ans. 32 - "The Bowl" See Also 2 TG 16:22: 2 TG 34:20: 6 Tr 43,45,46,47.

Note that on Zechariah 4 chart Inspiration places the term "Spirit of Prophecy on the bowl (writings) not the two pipes (the interpreters).

Therefore the living Spirit of Prophecy is the Living Word inspired, sustained, and enervated by the Holy Spirit. The human being, the prophet or messenger is the faucet or vessel through whom this Word is communicated. The human vessel is not ever living. Thus to have the living Spirit of Prophecy is to have a "Timely Message" an up-todate truth, this we have today in the Shepherd's Rod.

Prophet in the Church from Ezekiel 9 through the Kingdom Period

"Here is the Bible's own answer. which says that there is to be a people who will have the Testimony of Jesus Christ at the time the earth swallows up the flood, the hypocrites. And since this incident is yet future, it shows that there is to be a prophet in the Church, for the Bible's own interpretation of "the Testimony of Jesus Christ," is "the Spirit of Prophecy" (Rev. 19:10)." 2 TG 24:23.

2 Timely Greetings 24, p. 23 is often used by Bashanites to prove that there must be "a prophet" in the church before Ezekiel nine-when "the earth swallows up the flood."

Though this explains that there is to be a prophet in the church, it does not say before the earth swallows the hypocrites (Ezek. 9) but "at the time," and after. (See paragraph 2.)

We have no doubt that from Ezekiel Nine onward Brother Houteff

and all other faithful S.D.A.'S including the Church's founder E. G. White will come up in a special resurrection which will take place around the time of Ezekiel Nine and complete their work in the Kingdom. See Dan. 11:45; 12:1-3; 2 TG 7:9-11,1,5; 14 Tr 25; WHR 46; 2 TG 42:28,29; 2 TG 33:11; 1 TG 6:31; 12 Tr 37,38,55,56. These references show that Michael standing up (Ezek. 9) and the special resurrection takes place when the "King of the north, or Assyria looses a gigantic war in Palestine.

"All these taking place at this particular time, and the prophecies now unfolded, prove that antitypical Zerubbabel must now be here, and that as he has started the work, he also must finish it. The fact that Inspiration takes the pains to tell who is to finish the work in itself is proof that there must be active usurpers of his office as there were of Moses' office." 1 TG 14:21, 22.

Antitypical Zerrubbabel (Brother Houteff) is to start and finish His work. So there will be a prophet in the church throughout the pre-Millennial Kingdom period which is from Ezek. 9 onward to the 2nd Advent.

Is the Spirit Of Prophecy ever Ouiescent?

"Upon the death of Sister White, in 1915, the gift of Inspiration, the active Spirit of Prophecy, became quiescent, no longer manifesting Itself for a time. With the church thus cut off from the very source of its life, as was the Jewish church from the death of the prophet Malachi to the rise of John the Baptist, how could it maintain its vitality and growth? Hence, now as then, there has followed the same inevitable spiritual malnutrition and deformity,

accompanied with a long train of woes." 3 Answerer, p. 60.

Bashan tries to use the above reference to prove that the Spirit of prophecy was inactive or dormant between 1915 (Sister White's death) and 1930 when the Rod was introduced to justify the coming of another prophet now after the death of bro. Houteff. However, a careful study of the reference shows that the "gift of Inspiration" became quiescent, not the Spirit of Prophecy.

The words of counsel and admonition found in the writings of the spirit of Prophecy are active and speak to us continually. The Spirit of Prophecy is ever living, it is not a man or woman.

No Prophet in the Church before the Kingdom

Bro. Houteff does explain that the devil will try to decieve us by telling us that we are "poor in truth". 11 SC 2:11. We see this happening with the many winds of doctrines that are blowing in Davidia. Some teach, including Bashan, that we must have a living prophet now to guide us to the kingdom since Bro. Houteff is dead. Is this so? Well according to the following references, we see clearly that Bro. Houteff was the last prophet before Eze. 9.

GCS, p. 8—"Nevertheless, one's only safety will be in the teaching of Elijah, for there will be no other voice of timely Truth and authority to whom one may turn. Any others will lead their victims blind-folded into perdition."

GCS, p. 19—"This surely confirms the conclusion that since Elijah is to herald the great day, he can therefore be the only one who will rightly interpret the prophecies of the day, which are still mysteries to Christendom,.... To re-emphasize the fact, let it be said again that being the last of the prophets Elijah is, therefore, the only one who can open to our understanding all the prophecies of the Scriptures pertaining to the great and dreadful day of the Lord."

GCS, p. 23—"...Elijah is to be the last prophet to the church today"

GCS, pp. 31,32—"That as the Elijah of Christ's first advent was one person, and also as the Elijah of Mt. Carmel of old was one person, not a multitude of priests, then by parity of reasoning the Elijah of today must also be one person, not a multitude of ministers.

"The promise, itself, moreover, is for only one, not for more.."

9 Tr 67—"...the last Heaven-sent proclamation..."

13 Tr 11—"Last" prophet to the "World".

1 Ans. 78—"...the words of Malachi make plain that the Messenger of the Covenant is, in the strictest sense Elijah the prophet (Mal. 3:1-5; 4:5), the last messenger who prepares the way of the Lord."

2 TG 10:29 (3)—More light cannot come until the "sealing of the 144,000" has been effected.

See also 1 TG 11:12; 1 TG 14:21; 1 TG 5:12; 2 SR 9, 230, 231 (Bottom)

Whoever claims he has the Spirit of Prophecy has a timely message (2 TG 45:6). Whoever claims that He is a teaching prophet, or seeks to compel us to hear his message or voice, is an authority. This is a "Rank Imposter", and will lead "their victims blind-folded into perdition" (GCS 8). As John the Baptist was last before Christ's first Advent, the Elijah of today is the last before "the Great and Dreadful Day of The Lord". In other words, though we expect to

learn much more of God's word in the Kingdom, we have come to the last of the prophets. Ellen White said another would come (TM 475), but here we see that "one" clearly and emphatically from the Scriptures stated that we have come to the last. Thus the so-called prophets of today are contradicting the former messenger, thereby speaking against God and his truth. We must accept the message as it reads. See 1 Ans. 53; 3 Ans. 58; 1 SM 180,181.

We do not need a living prophet to lead us to the kingdom, the message is to accomplish that.

"Unmistakably, therefore, the clear light shedding forth from type, from testimonies of the prophets, and from history, identify the message of the Rod as the only one ordained to lead the latter day church, freed from sin and sinners, into the land of promise..." 3 Ans. p. 23.

The Porter is a Prophet

Bashan teaches that their leader is the one to inspect the sheep (members) to ensure they are worthy to enter the sheepfold. The idea that a man must inspect you is usurping the position of God.

God alone knows the heart. See 4 Testimonies, 453; DA 194; 4 Testimonies, 583; 5 Testimonies, 246.

In 1 TG 2: pp. 19, 20, bro. Houteff explains that the porter is the "one through whom the Spirit of Prophecy is manifested"-A prophet.

"Only those who gain entrance through the Door and to whom "the porter" (the one through whom the Spirit of Prophecy is manifested) opens are the authorized shepherds whose voices God's sheep hear."

The Porter is to open the door to those complying with the "Requirements". (1 TG 2:20.)

The Porter would be just an average mortal with a message from God.

Brother Houteff was therefore the Porter or prophet who brought the last message to the Church, thus he was the last messenger or Porter. He opened the door by bringing a message of truth. The key note is the truth, the message is what decides who enters or does not. The message inspects us, in other words. The Porter was guided by the Spirit to bring a present truth message which we must live up to thereby sealing the saints--opening the door to those who comply with its requirements.

A President is a Prophet

The Bashan adherents claim that we must have a president at all times to direct the affairs of the message, but this is not what the Rod message teaches. We need to first understand that a president is a prophet, this is according to The Leviticus, page 6.

"The president shall be called and chosen in accordance with the procedure set forth in Exodus, chapter three, verses ten, fifteen, and sixteen; chapter four, verse seventeen; Ezekiel, chapter three, verse seventeen; and Luke, chapter six, verse thirteen."

This reference unquestionably proves that a president is called in the same capacity as Moses, Ezekiel and the Apostles. In other words, he is a prophet. That is the reason why this Association (Mountaindale) does not have a president.

Here is another important point to consider. In the absence of the prophet how is the work to be administered?

"The Executive Council shall be patterned after the council described in Acts, chapter six, verses two to six.

"It shall have full executive and administrative power between sessions of the Association.

"It shall be vested with authority to grant credentials and licenses, and to fill vacancies that may occur in any of the Association's offices, save the office of President." The Leviticus, page 9.

We see clearly that the Executive Council has full authority to administrate the affairs of the work of God in the absence of the president.

The only position that cannot be filled by the Executive Council is that of the presient. Why? Because a president is called and chosen directly by God.

Conclusion

We have examined the core beliefs of the Bashan Association and proven from Inspiration that their teachings are unfounded and contrary to the fundamental teaching of the Rod. They have no foundation on which to stand. They are leading their victums blind-folded into perdition. Be aware.

We have presented the truth here so that you can study for yourself and hopefully escape the dreaded path of deception. We encourage you to study the Shepherd's Rod message deligently and become familiar with what it teaches, this is the only way to have your feet planted on the firm foundation of truth and to shun the many winds of false doctrines blowing every where.

The Dangers of Isms By V. T. Houteff

nce upon a time six brothers were building a bridge, supposedly to the god of Justice. The purpose of the bridge was to unite the east with the west.

They had no difficulty laying the foundations and setting the pillars. But, lo, when they came to join the east wing with the west one, they found themselves confronted with a phenomenal obstacle: What they had built up during the day was torn down during the night. This miracle continued day after day. Finally the brothers sat down in a council meeting to discuss how they might solve their harrassing problem. Feeling that to quit would be the greatest folly they could ever commit, that it would bring their names into disrepute, they studied and they prayed.

At long last they concluded that the god of Justice was for some reason displeased with them and that a human sacrifice would appease him. So it was that they resolved to sacrifice the best one of their wives. This however, was not to be divulged to the women. In order to make an impartial and acceptable selection, they further resolved that on the morrow each would instruct his wife to prepare the best possible breakfast and dinner, and to take the meals to him at the bridge as early as possible. They were to explain to their wives that they must needs eat and pray at the bridgeside to the glory of the god of Justice, and for the success of their project. The woman to arrive with the meals first was to be the victim.

Five of the men, though, did not stick to their solemn oath. Each of them straightway told their wives what was to be done, and that therefore they should not hurry to the bridge with the meals.

In the morning, at the appointed time, the men were at the bridge site. Shortly afterwards they saw in the distance someone coming to the bridge. For a few moments no one knew for sure who it was, but soon the man who had kept his part of the agreement recognized it to be his wife. He, of course, immediately burst into tears, and with groans he fell to the ground. Seeing her husband's strange behaviour, the wife dropped her basket of food and ran to the scene to learn what was the trouble. But while she was attempting to comfort her husband, the other five brothers seized her, carried her to a gap in the bridge, and there they cemented her alive. Now, the brothers confidently expected the bridge to stay up, for they felt that they had done all they could to appease the god of Justice.

Thus it was that while the five dishonest men that night returned home in happiness, the honest one returned to his home in grief.

On the following morning, all the men hurried to the bridge, expecting to find it standing intact. But to their surprise and consternation they found the whole bridge lying flat on the ground!

Naturally, the incident was rumored throughout the city, and the judges of that city went to see what the great excitement was about. As they listened to the builders argue and philosophize from cause to effect, they learned that the unfortunate woman was not sacrificed by fair chance, but by fraud! Thus they judged that the whole disaster was due to the fact that unjust men were trying to build a bridge in the honor of a just god! The matter was brought to court and the judges finally decreed that Justice must be satisfied, else not only the bridge, but even their city might fall to the ground. Accordingly, on that very day the five unjust men were executed, and the honest one was made mayor of the city.

Christians have been building a bridge, so to speak, to the God of Justice for many years. But they do not seem to be any more successful than were the six bridge-builders. And for what reason?—For the very same reason the six builders were unsuccessful: Selfish men are engaged in the work, and though they see the

need for a sacrifice, yet they somehow always manage to make others do the sacrificing.

And you remember that though the building of the tower of Babel was counter to God's will and His order, still all the while the builders worked harmoniously among themselves, their project prospered—their tower skyrocketed. But when their language was confused and they could no longer understand one another, then the progress of the tower stopped. And to show them that He was displeased with their project and that He was the One Who had confounded their language, God blasted the tower so that it crumbled to the ground. That which happened to the bridge happened also to the tower.

Christians are working at cross-purposes among themselves. One Christian brother is betraying another. Christian ministers, rather than preaching the Truth, are preaching against one another. One goes ahead to build up, and another trails behind to tear down. They do not see eye to eye; nor do they understand one another even as much as did the confused tower-builders.

Just so long as such selfishness and dishonesty, confusion and animosity, exist among Christians, their bridge and their tower, so to speak, will come to naught as certainly as did the bridge of the six covenant-breakers and as did the tower of the prophet Noah's mockers. There is no way of stopping ism trouble without removing the cause—no, no more than a splinter wound can heal before the splinter has been removed.

You are familiar with the fact that there was no ism trouble in Moses' day as long as Moses alone interpreted the Word of God to the people. But just as soon as Korah, Dathan, Abiram and others aspired to Moses' office ism trouble started. And the only remedy that even God Himself could find was to cause the earth to open her mouth and to swallow the ism-breathing multitude, the self-appointed representatives of God.

In our day there is an even greater flood of private interpreters of the Scriptures (the cause of today's isms) than there was in Moses' day. And according to Revelation 12:15, 16, the Lord warns that He will again use a remedy similar to the ancient remedy against today's ism-breeding flood. Then some may learn to respect the office of the Spirit of Prophecy. Let us now read of the fate of those who chose to continue walking in sparks of their own kindling.

Rev. 12:16—"...and the earth opened her mouth, and swallowed up the flood which the dragon cast out of his mouth."

Here we see that a similar remedy which caused isms to cease in Moses' day, is again to be used to cause isms to cease in our day, the only means by which harmony can be restored among fellow-members in the church itself, as well as among Christians in general.

2 Tim. 3:16, 17—"All scripture is given by Inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works."

2 Pet. 1:20, 21—"Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the Scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."


Affirmatively stated, all Scripture, not merely a part of It, is inspired. Negatively stated, none of It is privately interpreted, for the reason that It did not come of men but of God; that is, as the Spirit of God dictated to men the Scriptures, so the Spirit of God must interpret the Scriptures to men, that no man privately (without Inspiration) is capable of disclosing the sealed prophecies or interpreting any part of them or even capable of understanding their importance after they are interpreted except it be by the gift of the Spirit of Truth "None of the wicked," therefore, "shall understand; but the wise shall understand." Dan. 12:10.

We should now be convinced that as long as this Divine command and principle of interpreting God's Word is overlooked and abused, and as long as selfishness and bigotry exist among Christians in general and among Bible students in particular, isms will continue to increase, and the strength of the people will continue to be wasted just as was the strength of both the builders of the bridge and the builders of the tower. Yes, just as certainly as night follows day, just that certain will their efforts come to naught, and their shame be uncovered.

Those who do not avail themselves of the golden oil, and those who continue ever to hunt for some kind of oil, or whoever try to extract their own, will, of course, drop into the pit when the earth opens her mouth to swallow up the flood. Then it is that ism-breathers and ism-seekers shall forever pass away. \square

Embracing error may lead away from Christ

aith in a lie will not have a sanctifying influence upon the life or character. No error is truth, or can be made truth by repetition, or by faith in it. Sincerity will never save a soul from the consequences of believing an error. Without sincerity there is no true religion, but sincerity in a false religion will never save a man. I may be perfectly sincere in following a wrong road, but that will not make it the right road, or bring me to the place I wished to reach. The Lord does not want us to have a blind credulity, and call that the faith that sanctifies. The truth is the principle that sanctifies, and therefore it becomes us to know what is truth. We must compare spiritual things with spiritual. We must prove all things, but hold fast only that which is good, that which bears the divine credentials, which lays before us the true motives and principles which should prompt us to action.

An Outward Transformation of Character

As long as individuals are content with a theory of truth, and are yet

lacking in the daily operation of the Spirit of God upon the heart, which is manifested in outward transformation of character, they are cutting themselves off from the qualification that would fit them for greater efficiency in the Master's work. Those who are devoid of the Holy Spirit cannot be faithful watchmen upon the walls of Zion; for they are blind to the work that ought to be done, and do not give the trumpet a certain sound.

The baptism of the Holy Ghost as on the day of Pentecost will lead to a revival of true religion and to the performance of many wonderful works. Heavenly intelligences will come among us, and men will speak as they are moved upon by the Holy Spirit of God. But should the Lord work upon men as He did on and after the day of Pentecost, many who now claim to believe the truth would know so very little of the operation of the Holy Spirit that they would cry, "Beware of fanaticism." They would say of those who were filled with the Spirit, "These men are full of new wine."

The time is not far off now when

men will want a much closer relation to Christ, a much closer union with His Holy Spirit, than ever they have had, or will have, unless they give up their will and their way, and submit to God's will and God's way. The great sin of those who profess to be Christians is that they do not open the heart to receive the Holy Spirit. When souls long after Christ, and seek to become one with Him, then those who are content with the form of godliness, exclaim "Be careful, do not go to extremes." When the angels of heaven come among us, and work through human agents, there will be solid, substantial conversions, after the order of the conversions after the day of Pentecost.

Need for Understanding the Doctrine

Rebellion and apostasy are in the very air we breathe. We shall be affected by it unless we by faith hang our helpless souls upon Christ. If men are so easily misled, how will they stand when Satan shall personate Christ, and work miracles? Who will be unmoved by his misrepresentations, professing to be Christ when Sincerity will never save a soul from the consequences of believing an error.

it is only Satan assuming the person of Christ, and apparently working the works of Christ? What will hold God's people from giving their allegiance to false christs? "Go ye not after them" (Luke 21:8).

The doctrines must be plainly understood. The men accepted to teach the truth must be anchored; then their vessel will hold against storm and tempest, because the anchor holds them firmly. The deceptions will increase.

Satan is now more earnestly engaged in playing the game of life for souls than at any previous time; and unless we are constantly on our guard, he will establish in our hearts, pride, love of self, love of the world, and many other evil traits. He will also use every possible device to unsettle our faith in God and in the truths of His Word. If we have not a deep experience in the things of God, if we have not a thorough knowledge of His Word, we shall be beguiled to our ruin by the errors and sophistries of the enemy. False doctrines will sap the foundations of many, because they have not learned to discern truth from error. Our only safeguard against the wiles of Satan is to study the Scriptures diligently,

to have an intelligent understanding of the reasons of our faith, and faithfully to perform every known duty. The indulgence of one known sin will cause weakness and darkness, and subject us to fierce temptation.

Look Constantly to Jesus

Under the showers of the latter rain the inventions of man, the human machinery, will at times be swept away, the boundary of man's authority will be as broken reeds, and the Holy Spirit will speak through the living, human agent, with convincing power. No one then will watch to see if the sentences are well rounded off, if the grammar is faultless. The living water will flow in God's own channels.

Our only safety is in keeping fast hold of Jesus. Never are we to lose sight of Him. He says, "Without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:5). We must cultivate an abiding sense of our own inefficiency and helplessness and rely wholly on Jesus. This should keep us individually calm and steadfast in words and deportment. Excitement in the speaker is not power but weakness. Earnestness and energy are essential in presenting Bible truth, the gospel, which is the power of God unto salvation.

There are quicksands upon which many are in danger of being swamped. It is always safe to seek for the earnest of the Spirit of God, if we do not mingle with it a force and presumption that is not heaven born. There is need of caution in all our utterances lest some poor souls of ardent temperament shall work themselves up into a zeal not according to knowledge. They will act as though it was their prerogative to use the Holy Spirit instead of letting the Holy Spirit use them, and mold and fashion them after the pattern of the divine. There is danger of running ahead of Christ. We should honor the Holy Spirit by following where it shall lead. "Lean not unto thine own understanding" (Proverbs 3:5). This is one danger of those who teach the truth to others. To follow where Christ leads is a safe path for our feet. His work will stand. Whatsoever God saith is truth.

Satan will make use of every extravagant expression to the injury, not only of the speaker, but of those who shall catch the same spirit and infuse others to their harm. Calmness and solemnity should be cultivated; the solemn truths we dwell upon will lead us to manifest deep earnestness. How can we do otherwise when weighted with the most sacred message to bear to perishing souls—weighted by the sense of the nearness of our Saviour's coming.

If we are constantly looking unto Jesus and receiving His Spirit, we shall have clear eyesight. Then we shall discern the perils on every side, and shall guard every word we utter, lest Satan find opportunity to weave in his deceptions. We do not want to have the minds of the people wrought up into an excitement. We should not encourage an expectation to see strange and wonderful things. But teach them to follow Jesus step by step. Preach Jesus Christ, in whom our hope of eternal life is centered.

The Truth About SUSAIN

ften thought only to exist in desserts, candies and baked goods, sugar is hidden in many foods, is addicting, contributes directly to obesity and is an underlying factor in almost all cases of chronic metabolic diseases.

Sugar is found in foods that lack the ingredient's trademark sweetness. Sugar is a naturally occurring ingredient in many healthy foods but, when sugar is added unnaturally to food, it is refined and loses water, fiber and all other healthy nutrients.

The American Heart Association recommends that women eat no more than six teaspoons (about 25 grams) of added sugar daily and men eat no more than nine teaspoons (about 36 grams) daily.

For those who know the health risks associated with sugar, six to nine teaspoons of sugar a day seems like a reasonable amount. But, according to a study by the Harvard School of Public Health, 70% of Americans consume more than 22 teaspoons of added sugar daily.

Why the disconnect between recommended and average consumption levels? Added sugars are often lurking in everyday breakfast, lunch and dinner foods with scientific names at the end of ingredient lists: sucrose, glucose, fructose, high fructose corn syrup and lactose.

Problems Associated with Sugar Intake

The true purpose of eating aside from pampering your palate is to maximize bodily function with nutritional fuel. Sugar may enhance a dish's taste, but it is comprised entirely of empty calories that do not provide the body any redeeming nutrients. According to the Center of

Science in the Public Interest, people who consume too much sugar show lower levels of fiber, vitamins and mineral and other protective nutrients.

With no added benefits, it's important to consider the damaging effects that sugar has on the body. Dr. Robert Lustig, a professor of Clinical Pediatrics at the University of California, notes that the normal human body can safely metabolize around six teaspoons of fructose sugar per day. However, when fructose consumption exceeds six teaspoons—the case for most Americans—the excess is metabolized into body fat and leads to chronic metabolic diseases.

Liver Damage—Like alcohol, sugar gets transferred to the liver, which gets overloaded with sugar; this can lead to liver damage and disease.

Weight Gain—Sugar tricks the metabolism by turning off the body's appetite-control system. Additionally, sugar stimulates ghrelin, the "hunger hormone," and causes you to eat more and develop insulin resistance.

Metabolic Dysfunction—Sugar causes symptoms of classic metabolic syndrome like weight gain, abdominal obesity, decreased HDL cholesterol, increased LDL cholesterol and elevated blood sugar, triglycerides and blood pressure.

Increased Uric Acid—High levels of uric acid have a direct connection to increased risk of heart and kidney disease, as well as gout.

Risk of Heart Disease—According to a study by Harvard's School of Public Health, people with high sugar diets have an increased risk of death caused by heart disease. The study cites sugar's connection to

high blood pressure and its dumping of harmful fats into the bloodstream as the main factor in heart disease mortality.

Increased Cancer Cells—Sugar practically feeds cancer cells. One study found that sugar increases cancer cell proliferation by promoting cell division and accelerating cell growth, enabling cancer to spread faster.

Sugar's Effect on Children

With their minds and bodies still developing, it is imperative that children consume food that nourishes the body with essential nutrients. Sugar is the basis of many food advertisements geared towards children because sugar is a powerful, and addicting, stimulant that leaves kids wanting more and more sugary cereal, soda, fruit drinks and snacks.

While childhood consumption of sugar is down since 2000, kids are still getting 16% of their daily calories from sugar. A 2010 study by lead author Georgina Coade, PhD student at the University of Bristol, concluded that a high fructose diet:

Leads directly to early maturation visceral and subcutaneous fat.

Contributes to abdominal obesity and obesity below the skin.

High levels of fructose decrease cells' insulin sensitivity, which is necessary to take glucose from the bloodstream into fat and muscles.

In concert with obesity, decreased insulin sensitivity is a characteristic of Type 2 diabetes. With earlier contraction of Type 2 diabetes, children are at risk of developing advanced stage heart disease at a younger age.

Aside from obesity and diabetes, sugar-charged kids easily develop high blood pressure and high cholesterol—both contributors to heart disease. Francine Kaufman, director of Comprehensive Childhood Diabetes Center at the Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, states it plainly, "...a child with high blood pressure could have a heart attack at 35."

Substitute Natural Foods for a Sweet Tooth

Sugar doesn't just lurk in sweet treats like soda, fruit juices, candies and ice cream. Sugar is also found in processed foods including bread, meat, pasta sauce, Worcestershire sauce and ketchup. With so many non-sweet foods packed with sugar, it's easy to exceed the daily-recommended consumption of sugar during just one meal.

For example, one and a half cups of pasta, three quarters of a cup of pasta sauce and a salad with two tablespoons of French dressing equates to roughly 24 grams of sugar, or just about a woman's recommended daily amount and two thirds of a man's recommended daily amount.

With sugar seemingly everywhere, it is best to find natural sugars that match your sweet tooth and are loaded with essential nutrients.

Fruit—No, not the artificial kind that is packed with added sugar, but the kind that is delicious, nutritious and all natural. Aside from being a natural source of sugar, fruit is low in fat, sodium, calories and cholesterol. Additionally, fruit is full of essential nutrients like potassium, dietary fiber, vitamin C and folate, and has been linked to decreased risk of heart disease, heart attack and stroke.

Carrots—Carrots may not directly lead to improved eyesight, but they are excellent sources of natural sugar. Also, carrots are high in the antioxidant beta-carotene, vitamin A and minerals, vitamins and enzymes that aid in digestion.

Beets—Beets are great for satisfying sugar urges, and provide high levels of vitamin C, vitamin B, folate and potassium.

Can using 15 Bibles Bicury Give Us God's Words?

ight now, in almost any church you attend, something occurs that has rarely happened anywhere before the late 20th and early 21st century.

People use more than one Bible

Rick Warren's The Purpose Driven Life (2002) set the 21st century stage, using 15 different English translations and justifying it in an Appendix. He wrote, "...I have deliberately used paraphrases in order to help you see God's truth in new, fresh ways. English-speaking people should thank God that we have so many different versions to use for devotional reading."

15 different translations help you? You may find two or three synonyms, similar-meaning words, in a language, but 15? You're going to have interpretations -people's private commentaries—not translations. Want an example?

In Deuteronomy 23:18 God said, "Thou shalt not bring the hire of a whore, or the price of a dog, into

the house of the LORD thy God for any vow..." Sounds simple enough. The word "dog" (keleb) is translated "dog" all through the Old Testament. It means "dog," plain and simple. But in modern versions, you get interpretations like these:

"male prostitute's earnings" (in various forms, Holman Christian Standard, NIV, NRSV, NLT, NET, Common English Bible)

"the money given to one used for sex purposes in the worship of the gods" (Bible in Basic English)

This isn't translating. This is interpreting. They placed their opinion into the text, instead of the words God preserved. A true translator won't let his personal opinions or interpretations stop him from accurately transferring the Bible concept to the target language.

But most of those 15 Bibles don't just have changed translations. They are also translated from a changed text. As it says in "Did the Catholic Church Give Us the Bible?", historically there are two different streams

of manuscripts. The northern, preserved, apostolic stream comes from Antioch, where the disciples were called Christians first (Acts 11:26). But the southern, polluted stream seeps out of Alexandria, Egypt, the home of apostate Jewish and Christian-sounding philosophers.

Scholars from the southern stream took out the words of God they disagreed with and inserted words that fit their opinions. And yet most modern Bibles come from that polluted southern stream.

Bible-believers from the northern stream faithfully passed down and accurately translated the original concepts into other languages, without inserting their own private interpretations. So then, these preserved words aligned with God's standard.

All measuring tapes in the U.S. have to be calibrated against a standard, kept by the National Bureau of Standards. Jesus said His words would not pass away (Matt. 24:35). He left us a standard, so we can test all other "translations" and interpre-

tations.

Remove Acts 8:37, and you take away words that refute infant baptism. Remove "yet" from John 7:8 and Jesus becomes a liar. Remove "without a cause" from Matthew 5:22 and Jesus becomes an angry sinner! See why we need a standard?

An article on Crosswalk.com entitled, "How Do I Find the Right Bible?" ends with the question: "What about you? Which translation of the Bible do you use?" Who cares? Many modern Bible teachers spend so much time talking about using the Bible that they forget the point is to believe the Bible! They can't all,

as one author claimed, "contain the life-giving words of God."

God's words do not contradict each other

People use other Bibles but they do not believe them. How can they? They are constantly changed and disagree with each other in crucial places!

But thank God, we have His holy and preserved words in English, the King James Bible, straight from the northern stream. We can believe every word of our Bible.

It has never been a matter of which Bible we use. What matters is

which Bible we believe. Whether we use one Bible or 15 from the southern, polluted stream, filled with men's interpretations, we will only be deceiving ourselves" □



Antonio, Texas.




to different circumstances.


Lucina was a true missionary.

We all mourn the death of Lucina Littrean, and await the great day when Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ shall burst the clouds and return in majesty to claim His




Sis. Lucina with her three children
